BUSINESS CULTURE

Language:

Spanish is the official language of the Dominican Republic, and it is commonly used in business and government. However, English is also widely spoken, especially in the business community. Knowledge of Spanish can be advantageous for deeper business interactions.

Communication Style:

Dominicans are known for their warm and expressive communication style. They often use animated gestures and show enthusiasm in conversations. Formality is important, especially when addressing elders or people in positions of authority. Greetings typically include a handshake.

Cultural Diversity and Influence:

Dominican culture is a rich blend of Taino, African, and Spanish influences. This mix is evident in the country's music, dance, food, and festivals. The Dominican Republic was the site of the first European settlement in the Western Hemisphere, and its culture has been shaped by centuries of Spanish colonization, African heritage from the trans-Atlantic slave trade, and indigenous Taino traditions.

The Dominican Republic has a tropical maritime climate with little seasonal temperature variation. It is warm and sunny year-round, with average temperatures ranging from 22°C to 30°C. The rainy season typically runs from May to November, with brief but intense showers.

- 1. Safety: Exercise caution in urban areas, especially at night. Petty theft can occur, so keep valuables secure.
- 2. Transportation: Public transport can be irregular; renting a car or using taxis is recommended.
- 3. Local Etiquette: Be respectful of local customs and dress modestly when visiting religious sites
- 4. Food and Water: Drink bottled water and avoid eating unwashed fruits or vegetables. Be cautious with street food.
- 5. Medical Care: Travel insurance is advisable. Familiarize yourself with local health resources and emergency numbers

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

 What are the entry requirements of Dominican Republic?

Passport: Your passport must be valid for at least six months from the date of entry.

Travel Itinerary: You need a travel itinerary, including a return or onward ticket.

Visa-Free Entry: Aruban citizens do not need a visa for short-term stays (up to 90 days) for tourism purposes.

Tourist Card: For air arrivals, the \$20 USD Tourist Card fee is typically included in the airline ticket price. Electronic Ticket: All travelers must complete an electronic entry and exit form (E-Ticket) before arriving in the Dominican Republic. (https://eticket.migracion.gob.do/)
